The Holy Union Sisters is an international congregation committed to fostering unity and reconciliation in a broken world. We serve primarily the poor through education in all its forms, health care, pastoral ministry and social services. Our many and varied ministries respond to a broad spectrum of peoples' needs. Holy Union Sisters of the US Province minister in the United States, Africa and Haiti. We invite you to consider financial support for Holy Union Sisters who serve in these places.

***In the United States, where Holy Union Sisters minister, among the elderly, prisoners and the immigrant population for example:*** Sr. Barbara Walsh, S USC, ministers in a poor parish in New Bedford with immigrants teaching them English and providing 4 to 12 year old children with help on their home work. Sr. Ann Kernan and Sr. Una Davey assist the poor of their Kentucky Appalachian community with transport for doctors' appointments, church services and at times furnishings for their homes. Sr. Anne Boland, S USC and Helen Poirier are dedicated to one-on-one literacy education with immigrants who lack basic skills.

***In Africa where Holy Union Sisters minister in the areas of health care, basic development education and spiritual development for example: Cameroon -*** Sr. Fran Cavey, S USC ministers as a resource a person for the Ndop Spirituality Center and the Holy Union Sisters formation house. She also assists in giving retreats to Cameroonian women who are becoming Holy Union Sisters.

***Benin -*** Sr. Therese Theroux, S USC works in the spiritual and psychological formation of adults and young adults. She uses a workshop method called PHR (Personality Human Relations).

***In Port au Prince, Haiti where the Sisters serve in the ministries of nutrition education, traditional education programs and early childhood education for example:*** Sr. Eileen Davey, S USC ministers in Port au Prince, Haiti in St Louis de Montfort Parish. She provides daily meals for approximately one hundred children and offers early education to two to five year olds.

The above programs in Cameroon, Africa, and Port au Prince, Haiti would not exist if the Holy Union Sisters were not a presence in these two countries. The United States Province does financially sponsor these Sisters. If you would like to partner with the Holy Union Sisters to support the presence of Srs. The Holy Union Sisters are engaged in many ministries throughout the world; the above are a few examples of present needs.
